Updated Prop 218 Notice Mailing Completed by May 27th



- Original Prop 218 Notice sent in April for June 13 Public Hearing
- Data processing error in mailing list required a re-notice and delay of Public Hearing to July 11, 2017
 - In compliance with Prop 218 notice requirements
- If approved, FY18 rate increase would be effective on July 12, 2017
 - Impact of delay may reduce revenue by less than \$2 million compared to original budget plan (less than 0.3%)
 - Keep original budget plan and reduce expenditures if we see that FY18 revenues are falling short of budget



Prop 218 Rates and Charges

FY18 and FY19 Rates Developed from Proposed Budget and COS Study



- Revenue Requirement for FY18 and FY19 Proposed Biennial Budget yields increases:
 - 9.25%/9.0% for Water
 - 5.0%/5.0% Wastewater
- Proposed Rates calculated from Cost of Service (COS) Study
- Consistent with Board Policy and Proposition 218 requirements
- Schedule L Drought Rate Surcharges remains in effect in the unlikely event of a water shortage
 - Stage 0: 0% drought surcharge


Agency Comparison Consideration



- Based on recent District average single family residential use of 8 CCF/month (200 gpd)
 - Down from pre-drought historic average of 10 CCF/month (250 gpd)
- Average use varies by agency
 - Housing density,
 - Climate variation, and
 - Demographics
 - Schedule for rate changes vary agency


Water Bills Calculated for 8 CCF/Mo Annual Charge for SFR - Effective July 2017

Other Fees, Charges and Regulations - Water



Water Fees and Charges

 Account Establishment Fees, Charges for Special Services, Real Property Use Application Fees, Public Records Act Fees, and Recreation Fee increases to reflect District costs (approximately 2-5%)

Water Regulations

 Changes to Explanation of Terms, Applying for Service, Standard Service, Change in Size of Service, Protection of Public Water Supply and Water Efficiency Requirements address new state laws and backflow protection issues

Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) – In-Law Units



- Passage of SB 1069 and AB 2406 to Facilitate the Development of ADUs
 - ADU built within the existing space of a structure does not require a new utility connection or connection fee
 - Exempts ADU from the fire sprinkler requirement
 - Connection fees may be imposed if an ADU is built outside of the existing footprint or as a new structure

EBMUD Regulation Changes for Accessory Dwelling Units



- ADU's built within existing building footprint does not require District review of water service
- District will review ADUs built as new structures or when increasing building footprint
 - No SCC assessed if the existing meter can support the total water demand
 - If total water demand exceeds capacity of existing meter, upgrades of service and SCC are applicable
- · Changes to Regulations Sections 1, 2 and 3

Regulation Changes - Individual Metering



- Individual Metering Requirement -Effective 2018
 - New state law requires new multi-unit structures to sub-meter individual units
 - District currently requires individual District-owned water meters for each dwelling unit in multi-family residential up to three stories in height
 - To conform to new law, District would require individual District-owned meters or applicantowned sub-meters without height limitations
 - UPDATE: Proposed EBMUD regulation change effective date is January 1, 2018

Regulation Changes - Live/Work and Work/Live Designation



- Live/Work Vs. Work/Live
 - Clarifying Live/Work units as residential and Work/Live units as non-residential for the purposes of assessing the appropriate SCC

Regulation Changes - Backflow Prevention Devices



- Backflow prevention device requirements apply to all customers
- Single family premises using well water that have no cross connections to the potable system will be deemed a conforming customer
 - District will install and maintain a double-check valve and no further backflow prevention device requirements will apply
- · Single family premises requiring a Reduced Pressure Principle Backflow device (non-conforming customers) and all other backflow prevention device customers bear the cost of installation, inspection, and maintenance

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Other Fees, Charges and Regulations - Wastewater



- Wastewater Permit Fees
 - Increase fees for Discharge Permits and Estimation Permits (approximately 5% per year) to reflect District costs; Modify Limited Term Discharge Permit Fee and Treatment Charge
- ·Wastewater Private Sewer Lateral (PSL) Compliance Fees
 - Increase PSL Compliance Certificate fee \$25 and Time Extension fee \$7 to reflect District costs.
- · Wastewater Resource Recovery Rates
 - Add subcategory to Gray Water ("Brine") material type at \$0.05 per gallon (currently \$0.04 per gallon); Increase Brine rate by \$0.01 per gallon in FY19

Wastewater Limited Term Discharge



- · Limited Term Discharge Permits are used for groundwater disposal at construction projects
 - Current fee of \$995 does not cover staff costs to administer permit
 - Proposed fee increase to \$2,500 is needed to cover the cost of issuing permit, managing compliance requirements, and monitoring of ongoing discharge conditions and project changes
- Treatment charge for groundwater discharge will be significantly reduced
 - Reduce current fee 92% from \$0.02/gallon to \$0.0016/gallon to reflect low strength of groundwater discharge

Proposed Water and Wastewater Capacity Charges Increase



- Water System Capacity Charge (SCC)
 - Adjust charges for ENR Construction Cost Index
 - Updated costs for the Future Water Supply component
 - SFR SCC increase 4.5-4.7% for Regions 1, 2 and 3
- Wastewater Capacity Fee (WCF)
 - Adjust charges for ENR Construction Cost Index
 - Implement 5th year of 5 year phase-in of updated calculations from FY13; FY18
 - SFR WCF increase 16.7% from \$2,150 to \$2,510




