- FY07 to FY17 10 year water rate increase of 7.1% per year
- Increase in actual water revenue collected is only 3.8% per year
- 31% decline in volume of water sold explains difference




#### Water Bills Calculated for 8 CCF/Mo Annual Charge for SFR – Effective July 2017

#### **15.2 Drought Surcharges**

### **Drought Surcharges**



- Current water supply is over 600k acre-ft
  - Drought surcharges are not anticipated for FY18 and FY19
- Maintain surcharges in Schedule L Drought Surcharge Rate Schedule For Water Service
  - An available system of staged drought surcharges is part of the long-term financial stability efforts
  - Included in Proposition 218 Notice

## Other Fees, Charges and Regulations - Water



#### Water Fees and Charges

 Account Establishment Fees, Charges for Special Services, Real Property Use Application Fees, Public Records Act Fees, and Recreation Use Fee increases to reflect District costs (approximately 2-5%)

#### Water Regulations

 Changes to Explanation of Terms, Applying for Service, Standard Service, Change in Size of Service, Protection of Public Water Supply and Water Efficiency Requirements address new state laws and backflow protection issues

## Other Fees, Charges and Regulations - Wastewater



#### Wastewater Permit Fees

- Increase fees for Discharge Permits and Estimation Permits (approximately 5% per year) to reflect District costs; Modify Limited Term Discharge Permit Fee and Treatment Charge
- ·Wastewater Private Sewer Lateral (PSL) Compliance Fees
  - Increase PSL Compliance Certificate fee \$25 and Time Extension fee \$7 to reflect District costs
- Wastewater Resource Recovery Rates
  - Add subcategory to Gray Water ("Brine") material type at \$0.05 per gallon (currently \$0.04 per gallon); Increase Brine rate by \$0.01 per gallon in FY19

# Proposed Water and Wastewater Capacity Charges Increase



- Water System Capacity Charge (SCC)
  - Adjust charges for Engineering News Record (ENR) Construction Cost Index
  - Updated costs for the Future Water Supply component
  - SFR SCC increase 4.5-4.7% for Regions 1, 2 and 3
- Wastewater Capacity Fee (WCF)
  - Adjust charges for ENR Construction Cost Index
  - Implement 5<sup>th</sup> year of 5 year phase-in of updated calculations from FY13; FY18
  - SFR WCF increase 16.7% from \$2,150 to \$2,510

# Proposition 218 Protest Provisions



- If written protests are received by a majority of the affected parcel owners and tenants directly liable for the payment of the water and wastewater charges then the proposed rate changes can not be implemented
- The District has 382,114 water service accounts and 176,286 wastewater service accounts
- As of July 10<sup>th</sup>, 405 valid written protests had been received, which does not constitute a majority protest

# FY18 & FY19 Biennial Budget Proposed Staffing Changes



- Total authorized FTEs will increase from 2,068 to:
  - <del>2,102</del> 2,106 (FY18)
  - <del>2,109</del> 2,113 (FY19)
- Net increase of 41 FTEs:

# FY18 & FY19 Proposed Staffing Changes



Since the 4/11 workshop, new proposed FTE changes include:

- Temporary Reallocations (4.0)
  - 2 Temporary Administrative Clerks to Temporary Construction (TC)
  - 6 Temporary Meter Reader/Mechanic to Limited-Term (LT)
- TC Extension Status (3.0)
  - 3 Water Distribution Plumber I TC positions extended to July 23, 2017
  - Proposed in April workshop to convert TC to Regular
- Temporary Extension Status (3.0)
  - 6 Meter Reader/Mechanic Temporary positions extended up to six months

# FY18 & FY19 Proposed Staffing Changes



#### Cont.

- *Retitle & Change Character (0.0)* 
  - Manager of Meter Reading & Maintenance to Manager of Maintenance Support
  - Update salary grade from 80 to 86
  - Change character from Manager to Exempt status
- Change Character (0.0)
  - Senior Community Affairs Representative from Manager to Exempt status
  - No salary change
