Subject: Petitions for Retroactive Time Extensions (1990-2017):

- 1) Pardee Reservoir Hydropower Water Right Permit 10479 (Application 15201)
- 2) Camanche Reservoir Hydropower Water Right Permit 17378 (Application 25056)

Dear Ms. Ling:

Consistent with our recent discussions with you and your staff regarding the licensing of Hydropower Water Right Permits P10479 (Application 15201) and P17378 (Application 25056), the East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) hereby files the subject retroactive time extension petitions to cover the authorized use for the period from 1990 through 2017, to encompass the years of maximum use of the hydropower permits since the period of the permits ended in 1990.

As documented in the petitions, other legal users of water will not be impacted by these change petitions because the change petitions do not involve any additional appropriation of water; the hydroelectric rights are non-consumptive; and EBMUD does not propose any new construction or changes in its existing municipal and hydroelectric operations at Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs. In addition, EBMUD will continue to make required releases to meet the obligations to downstream water rights holders.

Per your direction, EBMUD submits the time extension petitions with the associated Environmental Information online through the SWB's new online water rights data system CalWATRS, and will mail the payment for the total filing fee of \$30,000 (\$10,000 for P10479 and \$20,000 for P17378) payable to the SWB and an additional payment of \$850 payable to the Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) to cover the relevant fee associated with the P17378 time extension petition. The filing fee to DFW for P10479 was made previously in conjunction with the change petition filed in 2012 and is consistent with Public Resources Code Section 10005(e) for a single project.

East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) requests a second time extension for its Camanche Hydropower Water Right Permit 17378 (Application 25056), to retroactively cover from 1990 through 2017. The previous time extension amended the project schedule for construction completion by December 1, 1985 and application of water to beneficial use by December 1, 1990. EBMUD completed construction in 1983 and applied water to beneficial use shortly thereafter. This petition for extension of time would be retroactive, extending from 1990 to 2017, so as to encompass the years of maximum use under the terms of Permit 17378 for licensing. This retroactive petition for extension of time would not result in any new construction or modification of existing facilities and would continue EBMUD's authorized use of existing hydropower facilities at Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs. Other legal users of water will not be impacted by the petition for extension of time because the hydropower rights are non-consumptive; the petition does not expand EBMUD's existing water rights to divert water from the Mokelumne River; and no changes would result to EBMUD's existing diversions. EBMUD routinely releases water from Pardee Reservoir to Camanche Reservoir at various times to assist in meeting state and federally imposed terms and conditions, including (a) releases to meet the SWB's decision in D-1641 requiring minimum fishery flow releases, which release requirements are also mandated by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC); (b) releasing cool water from Pardee Reservoir to Camanche Reservoir in summer and fall to be released from Camanche Reservoir for the benefit of the anadromous fishery in the lower Mokelumne River, as required by D-1641 and FERC; and (c) making flood control releases as required by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. EBMUD has and will continue to meet all release requirements at Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs. See Attachment 1 for additional details.

Response to Questions:

Complete Use of Water.

The purpose of this retroactive Petition for Extension of Time (petition) is to facilitate the licensing process for East Bay Municipal Utility District's (EBMUD) Camanche Reservoir Hydropower Water Right Permit 17378 (Application 25056). As background, water is diverted and stored in Camanche Reservoir under overlapping rights for multiple purposes. The State Water Board (State Water Board) approved Municipal Water Right Permit 10478 (Application 13156) in 1956, which allows EBMUD to divert and store water in Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs for municipal use in its service area. EBMUD also bypasses inflow or releases stored water from Pardee and/or Camanche Reservoirs to meet various downstream release requirements and generates hydropower when making such required releases. As a result, hydropower at Camanche powerhouse is generated with either bypassed inflows or releases of water previously collected to storage under the overlapping municipal and hydropower water rights at Camanche Reservoir.

The State Water Board approved Permit 17378 in 1978 for hydropower generation at Camanche Dam. In 1981, the State Water Board approved a time extension and amended the original project schedule for Permit 17378 as follows:

- Completion of Construction by December 1, 1985
- Complete Application of the Proposed Use of Water by December 1, 1990

EBMUD completed construction of the project in 1983 and began applying water to beneficial use shortly thereafter. EBMUD subsequently pursued licensing of the Permit; however, the process was delayed by a series of extenuating and unavoidable circumstances including negotiations regarding downstream flow targets as described below. EBMUD has applied additional water to beneficial use from 1990 to 2017 under Permit 17378 as it continued to legally operate its hydropower plant and exercised due diligence to pursue licensing.

The maximum diversion rate (14-day average of 335 cfs) was demonstrated in water year 1986 and the maximum diversion to storage amount (301,270 AF) was demonstrated in water year 1993. The maximum annual total beneficial use (193,953 AF) was demonstrated in water year 1987 and the maximum total appropriation (367,590 AF) was demonstrated in water year 2017. EBMUD is requesting a retroactive time extension for Permit 17378 through September 30, 2017 to include these diversion and use quantities.

EBMUD has engaged in deliberate, planned, and well-understood coordination efforts of multiple related regulatory processes leading to the current time extension petition request for Permit 17378.

In 1995, the State Water Board agreed to postpone a scheduled licensing inspection to allow EBMUD to complete negotiations with downstream entities and resource agencies regarding fishery flows. In 1998, the Joint Settlement Agreement (JSA) was reached between EBMUD, the US Fish and Wildlife Service and the California Department of Fish and Game (now Department of Fish and Wildlife). The JSA includes a series of flow, non-flow, and other measures designed to protect and enhance the anadromous fishery and ecosystem of the lower Mokelumne River. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) also issued an Order Approving Settlement Agreement and Amending License on November 27, 1998, amending EBMUD's FERC License for the Lower Mokelumne Hydroelectric Project (FERC Project No. 2916) by requiring the JSA measures. Additionally in 2000, the State Water Board incorporated the flow provisions of the JSA into EBMUD's Mokelumne River municipal water right Permit 10478 and License 11109 through State Water Board Decision 1641 (D-1641). By that action, the State Water Board replaced the previous fishery flows that were required under a 1961 Agreement between EBMUD and CDFW, with the 1998 JSA flows in EBMUD's water rights. EBMUD continues to make fishery releases to the lower Mokelumne River consistent with the JSA and D-1641.

In April 2000, the State Water Board recommended that EBMUD delay the licensing request for hydropower water right Permit 17378 and also for its hydropower water right Permit 10479 (Application 15201) at Pardee Reservoir, until it requested a license for its municipal water right Permit 10478, to address both consumptive use and hydropower generation aspects of the project simultaneously. In November 2000, EBMUD filed a petition for time extension for its municipal Permit 10478.

On July 29, 2008, EBMUD requested a licensing inspection with the State Water Board regarding Hydropower Permit 10479 and Permit 17378, noting that EBMUD had requested a time extension for its municipal Permit 10478 in November 2000.

In 2012, after the State Water Board completed the inspection of EBMUD's project facilities and operations, EBMUD filed separate change petitions to confirm Camanche Dam as a point of diversion and Camanche Powerhouse as a place of use under three hydropower rights at Pardee Reservoir (License 1388, License 6062, and Permit 10479). These change petitions are summarized in EBMUD's municipal Permit 10478 Time Extension Project Draft Environmental Impact Report, completed in September 2013.

Later in 2012, the State Water Board and EBMUD agreed to prioritize the petition for time extension for municipal Permit 10478 ahead of further processing petitions or licensing the two hydropower permits. In 2016, the State Water Board approved the municipal petition for time extension and change petitions, issuing Amended Permit 10478.

In 2017, due to other higher priority projects arising at the time, EBMUD and the State Water Board agreed to postpone the licensing process for Hydropower Permit 10479 and Hydropower Permit 17378. In 2023, EBMUD and SWRCB agreed to reinstate work to complete the licensing process for both Permit 10479 and Permit 17378. In May 2025, EBMUD received State Water Board's approval of the water accounting procedures for the hydropower change petitions (Permit 10479 and Permit 17378) – the final licensing quantities of water beneficially used under Hydropower Permit 17378 reflects this accounting.

From the resulting sequence of events, EBMUD has demonstrated due diligence to develop the rights of its hydropower permits within the larger series of regulatory proceedings affecting the permitting and operations of EBMUD's Pardee and Camanche Reservoirs.

Approval of this retroactive time extension will not cause any significant environmental impacts or injure other legal water users or other beneficial uses because the hydropower use is non-consumptive and the water is released back to the Mokelumne River as hydropower is generated; EBMUD will continue its existing operations to meet all release requirements at Camanche Reservoir; and approval of the petition will not expand EBMUD's existing water rights to divert from the Mokelumne River, either directly, or to storage. EBMUD's direct diversion of water for hydropower purposes results in a bypass of inflow through generation facilities and does not change the volume, rate, or timing of the available flows downstream. Furthermore, the diversion to storage season and storage quantity for Hydropower Permit 17378 overlaps with the storage season and quantity for Municipal Permit 10478. All water collected to storage in Camanche Reservoir under Hydropower Permit 17378 is also collected for municipal use under Permit 10478. As a result, approval of this petition does not enlarge or affect the existing authorized rate of diversion or existing authorized quantity for collection to storage under Permit 17378, nor the timing of such diversions. Accordingly, the requested retroactive time extension for Hydropower Permit 17378 will not result in injury to any downstream users or beneficial uses.

Approximate Amount Spent on Project

EBMUD spent approximately \$19.8 million to complete the construction of the hydroelectric project by 1983. Since that time, EBMUD continues to fund improvements on a periodic basis to maintain and improve the reliability of project facilities necessary to apply water to beneficial use under Permit 17378. Between fiscal years 2021 through 2025, EBMUD expended approximately \$300,000 in total to maintain the hydropower facilities at Camanche Powerhouse.
