

- CUPA/Administering Agency (AA) / Participation Agency (PA), if difference from local fire
- California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) State Warning Center
- County Agricultural Commissioner

In addition, as necessary, one or more of the following:

Spills on Public Roadways:

• California Highway Patrol: 911

Spills in or Near Waterways:

- U.S. Coast Guard
