WSID1602 clarifications in response to bid questions are as follows (2 pages):

Question: **Are we required to place an ad in a newspaper to meet the CEP requirements? Please clarify CEP requirements for this proposal.**

Answer: No, for most professional services proposals an ad is not required.

The District does not REQUIRE the use of any firms. We do have the following contracting objectives (goals) for professional services contracts:

White Men	25%
White Women	6%
Ethnic Minorities	25%

However these objectives only apply if there are any subcontracting opportunities. Based on the individual firm's need for subcontractor/subconsultants, we will then review their good faith outreach efforts to diverse firms. For most professional services proposals, the placement of an ad in a publication is not required and typically not possible with the short timeframe given for submission of a proposal.

Basically for professional services contracts, if the prime consultant is bringing other consultants in as part of their team, we want them to reach out to a diverse pool of firms and to document the good faith efforts that they felt were appropriate for this specific project.

Question: **Was the pump station component evaluated at a programmatic or project level of review in the DERWA SRVRWP 1996 EIR?**

Answer: Project level

Question: **Tasks 2 and 6 in the requested scope of services include SRF related actions, however, Prop 1 grant funding includes only state bond money (no SRF or other federal money). Are SRF funds potentially being sought in addition to Prop 1 funds?**

Answer: At this time, EBMUD does not plan on seeking SRF funds. Task 2.1 is in response to a preliminary comment by the SWRCB in 2016 after Prop 1 grant funding CEQA staff informally reviewed the 1996 EIR. Task 6.2 describes optional services should EBMUD later decide to seek SRF funding.

Question: Can EBMUD provide an e-copy of the 1996 Draft EIR? The 1996 Final EIR is available online, but the Draft EIR is not.
